My Dear Friends

How often we hear people say that God is remote! Some situation arises and God seems to be absent - he says nothing and does nothing. When these occasions come I always recall some wise words - "If you think that God is distant don't be mistaken about who has moved!" These words can equally be applied to the speaking and doing as well. Has God stopped speaking or is it that we have stopped listening? Has God stopped doing or is it that we have stopped noticing? Does God no longer hear prayers or is it that we are in the wrong place?

God is always speaking, doing and longing to hear our prayers - 'he is more ready to hear than we to pray' as a familiar prayer puts it. So are we in the right place? So many of our prayers finish with 'through Jesus Christ our Lord' yet the reality is that it is more often a formula than an acknowledgment of the one and only way to the Father. Jesus is the unique way to the Father and if we search Scripture we can find no other way. Jesus himself stated this categorically when he said "I am the Way .. no one comes to the Father except through me". Closeness to Jesus, openness to the Holy Spirit and obedience to His Word are essential for the life of prayer which is primarily the submission of our will to His. The more we are in Him and He is in us the more our prayers cease to be requests for God to do and the more they become a desire to be involved in what God is doing.

Jesus always looked to see what the Father was doing before he acted. God is always taking the initiative and waiting for us to link our wills to His. Jesus gave us the model - oneness with God so he saw and heard what God was doing and saying, and obedience so that what God purposed happened through Him.

True prayer is being where God is - in Him and He in us so that God can reveal His purpose, and speak and do in this world today through us. So much of our prayer seems ineffective because it starts in our wanting and not in our waiting on and being in His will. God has not moved - too often we are in the wrong place.

### **The Parish Calendar**

Over the last few months there have been a few errors for which we apologise. These are noticed very soon and corrections are printed on the weekly service sheet available each Sunday in both Churches. The normal pattern is for the 8 a.m. Holy Communion to be celebrated at Milnthorpe on the 1st and 3rd Sundays and at Heversham on the 2nd, 4th and 5th Sundays.

If there is a United Service later in the morning this can affect the venue for the 8 a.m. service. When the United Service is held in a Church on a Sunday when it would normally have a Service at 8 a.m. then the 8 a.m. Service will be transferred to the other Church, so that there will always be a morning service in each church.

When these situations arise the change will be underlined and printed in bold lettering in the Parish Calendar so that it will not be seen as a mistake. The first use of this form of notification is on Sunday 29th July.

## **JAMES BENNETT**

St. Peter's helped to sponsor James for this year. He writes: 'All good things must come to an end!' A phrase I don't particularly like and don't necessarily agree with, but as July rapidly approaches the inevitable is happening and my time here in rural Suffolk is coming to a close. My year working for a church in the small village of Mendlesham has flown by and it will be with great sadness that I leave. The church has seen rapid growth in the last few years with over 230 people attending most weeks, a third of them being young. It has been really encouraging to see that while the predominant trend is one of decline, there are some churches that are growing. My role has been predominantly with the young people, leading cell groups, running a kids club, going into three local schools to help with PE lessons, lunchtime and after school sports activities and occasionally taking assemblies. I have had a number of great experiences during the year one being a visit with the church to



Croatia, where we ran a holiday club for the children in the village of Sirac and worked with the Baptist church - six children became Christians while we were there. It was amazing, that despite our differences in culture and language, we could still worship the same God together. I found it very humbling to meet so many people who had suffered so much and had so little, and yet were so generous towards us. Experiences such as these challenge you to be far more generous to those in need and make you realise how fortunate we are.

#### **NISCU - SOUTH LAKES**

The second half of term has been going well for Libby. She has been in schools almost everyday and took Queen Katherine's CU to Camelot which was a great occasion. Her theme in schools and clubs has been Pentecost and relating the power of the Holy Spirit to individual lives. The camps are also for youngsters from North Lancs. and the Craven area.
