My Dear Friends

Soon, hopefully, we will be in the season when children armed with buckets and spades are taken to the seaside. They build their sandcastles only to have them washed away by the waves. The children soon learn that you can't make the waves stay still - they are always moving. Movement, not being able to keep things where they were once, is something we try to forget about as we grow older. We find change a problem. This carried through to the Faith and the great danger there is that we try to pin Jesus down, set him in some mould or capture him in some outward form.

Jesus' appearances after his Resurrection show quite clearly that Jesus is not to be restricted, that he is always taking the initiative and that he is moving on, going ahead of and surprising his people. The Ascension, which we remember this month, was the final lesson about this for the disciples. The full meaning of those amazing words 'He is not here, He is risen' finally went home.

We need to learn this lesson also. We cannot close our books at the end of a service, leave Jesus there in the pew and next Sunday expect to pick him up where we left off. He is not there because He is risen, going ahead of his disciples. Neither can we trap him in a particular form of words whether they be Common Worship or BCP, Mission Praise or Psalms, informal or traditional. Jesus can appear anywhere and in anything. He is never limited, but we so easily limit our receiving of him because so often we appear to love the vehicle more than the One to whom the vehicle is to take us, and the method of approach more than the One who is to be approached.

Following the Ascension the disciples met together with their minds focussed on Jesus, waiting for what He had promised. They listened rather than talked, waited rather than acted and when Jesus' promise was fulfilled they were surprised but not taken unawares, they were excited and enthusiastic for whatever came. They experienced Pentecost because they had learned that they could not limit Jesus in any way and that they could not programme him to their ideas.

He is not here, He is risen, He is ascended and He comes to all in whom there is an openness to His Spirit. No wonder that old hymn tells us to keep our 'eyes fixed upon Jesus'. If we don't we won't see where He is going and as a result we won't be able to follow.

May we all keep our eyes fixed on Jesus.



Combined Easter Service

On Good Friday morning, the combined Churches of Milnthorpe & Heversham held a meaningful outdoor service at the foot of St. Thomas' Church steps attended by members of all churches plus other visitors. The service, led by the Rev. Canon John Hancock included music for hymns and readings and prayers by representatives of all churches.

Visit of Diocesan Secretary: Congregations were pleased to welcome the Rev. Canon Colin Hill, Residential Canon of Carlisle Cathedral and Diocesan Secretary, to a United Parish Communion Service at St. Thomas Church. Canon Hill gave the sermon and later met parishioners of both Churches in the Church Centre. During the previous week he visited St. Peter and St. Thomas parishes and also attended a meeting of both PCC's members and church members at St. Peter's Church. During the year 2002 senior staff of Carlisle Cathedral will visit each parish in the Diocese.

Blood Doning The Lancaster branch of the National Blood Transfusion visited Dallam School Hall when 131 donors attended the event. Local ladies, Sylvia Argles (tea), Ailsa Brookes and Mary Davidson (bandaging) gave voluntary assistance.

Visually Impaired members meeting

Mrs. Mary Reckett of Haverbrack was the speaker at the April meeting of the Visually Impaired group of which she is a member. She spoke of life in Hull when her husband, Basil, was High Sheriff there thirty-one years ago and as his 'Lady' attended many functions and banquets. Together they visited Hull's twin town in Germany and whilst there visited the Dam of Dambuster fame.

Life Support Demonstration "An evening of Basic Life Support' was the name of a demonstration given at Milnthorpe Family Centre by Gary Parsons of Levens. £56 was raised towards Family Centre funds.

Residents Meeting At a meeting of Milnthorpe Residents Association held at the Cross Keys Hotel, Chairman Malcolm Alston of SLDC introduced Ian Stewart, County Council: Richard Greenwood - Head of Housing, Nick Lomax SLDC and Acting Police Inspector Sean Murphy and another police officer. An important matter of concern about the large number of coaches, buses and cars that travel along Haverflatts Lane to Dallam School was discussed. Residents are gravely worried about the danger and 500 signatures have been collected supporting a suggested new entrance. Complaints included, speeding, parking in front of residential entrances, paths being blocked by vehicles, kerbs on the Square, poor lighting in certain areas, blocked drains and heavy goods vehicles passing through the village.

Congratulations to Marie and Jack Cordukes on celebrating 25 years of shop keeping at their general village store in the Square. Both sides of the family have a long history of shop keeping in Milnthorpe: Marie's relatives had a grocery shop in Harmony Hill, while Jack's father ran a men's outfitters next to the post office and Jack used to have a hairdressing business. Good luck to both for the future.

Jubilee Day: At a meeting of the Men's Forum held at the Cross Keys Hotel, Mark James, Chairman of Milnthorpe Golden Jubilee Village Party described the plans and arrangements being made for the party on June 3rd.

The out of School Club which is part of Milnthorpe Family Centre, provides care for 4-12 year olds. Based at the Primary School, the Club is open from close of school day until 6 p.m. and from 8 a.m. - 6 p.m. during holidays - Joey's day care - also part of the Family Centre offers day care for 2-5 years olds. Registered with OFSTED, both have developed policies and procedures to safeguard the safety and welfare of attending children with qualified and experienced staff. They have had a wide range of activities and holiday clubs during the Easter holidays, including Joey's trip to Docker Farm to support the children's topic "On the Farm".


HEVERSHAM ST. PETER'S JUNIOR HANDBELL RINGERS
