My Dear Friends

The moment we begin to think about God our emotions start getting disturbed. This should not surprise us. How can we expect to meet with God and come off unscathed? The danger for us lies in rejecting what God is wanting to do in our lives. So often the rejection is because of fear and misunderstanding. Let us look at those two reactions.

Fear. We react in fear because, wrongly, we see the new thing God is wanting to do in our lives as threatening what we already know of God, as denying our past experience of God, as rejecting all that has previously been done and as even contradicting a life of service that has helped us. This is not so. God wants to take all that, bless it, revitalise it, renew it and use it to build on just as that experience built on what went before it. In the Bible 'do not be afraid' or very similar occur about 365 times, many of those occasions in the Nativity narrations. God all the way along has had to reassure his people who were frightened at the prospect of the new thing he was about to do. God will not harm us, he only wants to build us up, help us to grow and, most certainly, he does not want us no further forward than this time last year.

Misunderstanding. This comes in two forms: one is deliberate because we want an excuse to stay as we are, the other is the genuine kind. Because of different approaches we have not perceived the underlying truth God wants us to grasp. Factors, human and otherwise, which are different from our previous experience cause us problems. We should not reject something because it is different. We should allow God to reveal himself to us through it.

It is said that so many, including Christian Leaders, get worried when there is talk about the renewing of the Church. All they want is peace which means no change. That peace, which means no growth, is preferred to renewal, growth and a living Church. Growth can upset. A growing Church pushes through the concrete of complacency, the asphalt of apathy and the paving of the past. We cannot beat nature so why do we continue to think we can prevent God from renewing his Church by and through the Holy Spirit? Let us pray that God will renew us, his Church here, and that he will do a 'new thing' in our lives and in our communities.

Bibi - Famine Appeal, N. Benin - an update

Bibi sends her thanks for our contribution of £300 sent in April and explains the way the distribution of the grain has been organised

- 15 tonnes of grain was bought with money sent by many churches
- storage space was found in 3 villages covering the area
- those in real need and with no money to buy grain were identified (widows, elderly people)
- those who were short of food but who could pay a small amount for grain were identified (in Benin, if something is given away it tends not to be valued)
- the small amounts of 'profit' from the sale of the grain will be used to buy fertilizer to improve the next harvest
- grain was then distributed discreetly to those in need by trusted local Natemba people.

Thank you again for all your help. It has been a great encouragement to me and of course to my friends in need in Benin. May the Lord bless you richly. Bibi Nedellec.

Hope Now - Bicycle Tour in Ukraine

Many who read this will know the name Tarasenko - Sasha T. was the Governor of Prison 62 in Ukraine (until he became a Christian and, consequently, lost that job), and both he and his elder daughter, Olga, have spoken in St. Peter's. Sasha and his wife, Irene, have started a Cycle Club for the young people of Cherkassy; with funds from HOPE NOW Prayer Partners they have been able to buy 40 bikes, and from 30 July - 6 August this young group will do an evangelistic cycle tour. They will cycle about 40 miles each day. Vic Jackopson will cycle with them, and in every place through which they pass they will share the staggering news of the Christian gospel. Book Review

Several Times a year we hope to include a book review in the newsletter. There are so many good Christian books available that it is often difficult to know how to choose a suitable one and we end up reading none! The books we will select will not be heavy theological tomes, but books to inspire, inform and help us on our Christian journey. Our first certainly falls into this category.

It is written by a Dutch woman, Anneke Companjen wife of Johan, the President of Open Doors International, an organisation whose workers take the Gospel to some of the most difficult and dangerous places in the world. During travels with her husband, Anneke has become more and more aware of the tragic toll persecution takes on families. Christian husbands - many of them pastors and church leaders are abused, imprisoned and sometimes martyred. Their courageous wives are often overlooked and forgotten; these women struggle with separation and uncertainty, are frequently ostracized by their culture, left to care for their children alone and are often subjected to crushing poverty. Their faith is stretched to the limit and yet they are rarely the subjects of prayer campaigns or human rights projects. At a time when women's rights have become a popular cause, their needs are unknown or forgotten.

"Hidden Sorrow, Lasting Joy" is a tribute to such women and tells the stories of twenty-two of them from Asia, through the Middle East to Africa, Latin America and yes, Europe; the latter telling the story of the remarkable women in Chechnya. At one level the book is grim reading as one learns of the immeasurable suffering endured by these families, but shining through that is the inspiration and challenge which lift one's mind and heart, to the unfailing goodness and faithfulness of God and to the joy we can have in serving him.
