My Dear Friends

We are know the Lord's Prayer, don't we? Or do we? And if we do, do we know what it means? We are familiar with the children's errors such as, 'Harold by Thy name', 'on earth as it is in Devon' and 'lead us not into Thomas Station'. The problem is that these errors sound almost right and prove that the content cannot possibly be understood. Are the other parts any better understood? Let us do a bit of 'unpacking', particularly of the part which connects very closely with Christian Aid Week (11—17 May).

The prayer starts with the word 'our', meaning God is your father and mine. But wait a minute! People all over the world say that word 'our' too. That makes them, no matter what their race, colour, ethnic origin or nationality, our brothers and sisters. We can cope with that because we never have to meet with them. The remoteness makes 'our' unthreatening.

But later in the prayer we say 'give us this day our daily bread'. It is a prayer not to be greedy and hoard but to take each day as it comes trusting God to provide for us. Bread here stands for all that is necessary for living. This is so easy for us to pray knowing that we have a freezer full and that if we run out we can easily get to a shop. Again, let us wait a minute. Others are saying this prayer with nothing on their plates let alone a store in their freezer (if they had one) and nothing in their shops. What the prayer is saying is this 'may all of us who say this prayer have sufficient for each day's needs. It is 'give us' not 'give me'. Can one member of the family eat a feast while another beside them starves? The brother or sister may be half the world away but the question still stands. A few years ago Christian Aid had the slogan 'May we live simply that others may simply live'. That is still a challenge to us today. Christian Aid challenges us to take seriously the 'our' and the 'us' in the Lord's Prayer. This prayer is one we cannot take lightly or say without proper understanding. If we do we are doing no better than those children who made those errors.

Christian Aid Week is one of the opportunities to practice what we pray and put the 'me' into 'us' and share, as Jesus bids us, with our brother and sister in need. How can we say the love of God is in us if we see others in need and do nothing about it? Are we quite so keen now to say the Lord's Prayer or are we more determined to live it?

With every blessing and may the love of God be in us all.

Happy Easter

Easter joys have been ours ... the beauty of God's glorious Springtime, and the Blessing of His redeeming love — Holy Week has passed, but long remembered — Palm Sunday's Holy Communion Service, with a dramatic reading of the Passion of Jesus, by members of the congregation, and palm crosses for all present; followed by the Last Supper on Maundy Thursday. On Good Friday morning an open-air Ecumenical Service was held at the foot of St Thomas' Church, attended by approximately 200 people, welcomed by the Vicar, who later gave a talk, with Bible reading by Father Don Darragan, and prayers by Sue Hilton (Methodist Church). Hymn music was organised by the Vicar.

St Thomas' Church was bright with Spring flowers on Easter Day: Reader Roger Bingham led the opening Morning Service of Communion with Sermon by the Vicar, prayers by Kathleen Dawson, and Bible readings by John Thorley and Linda Baverstock. The Ven Peter Dawson was Celebrant, Arthur Dewhurst — Organist.

Delightful Occasion

There was a large congregation at St Thomas' Church on Mothering Sunday, welcomed by the Vicar and the Ven Peter Dawson, with special welcome to Jamie and Janet Walshaw, who had brought their 5 month old triplet daughters, Lauren, Bethany and Katie, for Baptism, accompanied by their 7 year old sister Gemma. Daffodil sprays were presented by all children to their mothers, also to all ladies present. Following the Service, pieces of Simnel cake, made by Mrs Kathleen Dawson, were served in the Church Centre, to all present.

Thanks and Praise

At St Thomas' Church Annual Vestry Meeting, the Vicar paid tribute to retiring (and then re-elected) Churchwardens John Ricketts and John Thorley, for all support and work during the past year. In his later report he stated two main achievements had been the restoration of the Church roof, thanks to the huge financial response: also refurbishment of the kitchen due to money raised by the weekly coffee mornings organised by Mr and Mrs Gregory, and the catering team. The Church Centre has been painted, and the Church itself to be carpeted shortly. Electoral Roll Officer, Mary Davidson reported 63 names to be on the Electoral Roll: Gwen Tuer gave an account of Mothers' Union activities: Nancy Flynn replaced Steve Alderson as Deanery representative. Thanks were expressed by the Vicar to the many people contributing to the life of the Church, especially the Ven Peter Dawson, Rev Ron Rutter, all Readers, bell ringers, those organising study groups, prayer groups, church rotas, grass cutting, and to Glyn Hopkins, Choirmaster for choir work, and arranging Concerts.

The Churchwardens thanked the Vicar for all he does, and wished him good health for the future.

During the year 2002, grants given to various village organisations amounted to £5430.00 of which £2,500 was donated towards the Golden Jubilee Day Celebrations. All officers were re-elected. A request received from Milnthorpe Snooker Club, towards recovering the snooker tables, was granted.

M P Opens Community Development Centre

The official opening of Milnthorpe Community Development Centre at the Primary School took place on 4 April by Tim Collins, MP. Guests were welcomed by Andy Blackman, Manager and Head Teacher. The event was to celebrate opening of the re-located Centre — the IT Centre originally began in 1998, being part of Cumbria Credits, and there are now 73 Centres across Cumbria, encouraging life-long learning, advantageous to adults. Establishment of the Centre, includes pre-school care, after school and holiday clubs. Mr Blae Rwan then introduced Tim Collins MP, who cut the ribbon leading to the new department, saying that this was a huge event in the history of Milnthorpe, giving enriched learning opportunities.

Music by Milnthorpe Steel Band completed the evening.
