

My Dear Friends,

I start with a disclaimer! Don't thank me, thank Peter Dawson for last month's letter. Peter wrote it, but unfortunately his name was missed out.

This month (on 3rd. July) we celebrate St. Thomas' Day. This is just a few days after St. Peter's Day (29th. June). What a remarkable pair of Saints our parishes have! Yet most people focus on their failures instead of their triumphs. People remember that Thomas doubted and that Peter sank. We have in our language that phrase 'a doubting Thomas' which I should like to see erased. Why? Because, like Peter's sinking, it directs our attention to the wrong place. Thomas was no different from the rest of the disciples. They all doubted and thought that what the women said about Jesus being raised was all nonsense. We cannot take comfort from what we like to call their failures because they pale into insignificance in comparison with their triumphs. Much better that we seek to follow their examples in following and speaking out for Jesus.

Thomas, when he met the risen Jesus, made what must be the most amazingly accurate summary of who Jesus was - 'My Lord and my God'. Can we bring ourselves to say that in front of all our close friends and colleagues? Then later he went to India where he built up groups of Christians and in the end was

martyred for his faith in Jesus. Where is the doubter in that?

What about Peter who sank and later denied he knew Jesus? Let us not forget that he first walked on the water, that he came out with that great acclamation 'You are the Christ, the Son of the living God', that his first sermon brought about the conversion of 3,000 people and that he too was martyred because he would not deny Jesus. How do we measure up to that?

Various things stand out as we look at the lives of these two Saints. They both responded to Jesus' initial call 'Follow me'. They did that not knowing where it would lead them - they simply trusted Jesus. At times they may have got things wrong but they were learning all the time. They knew Jesus and knew that he was alive after his crucifixion because they met him. And then they received the promised Holy Spirit who would enable them to be witnesses to Jesus. This they did regardless of the personal cost.

We, too, can meet Jesus today because he is alive and we can receive the gift of the Holy Spirit who will enable us to be witnesses for Jesus where we are and help us to make a difference to those we meet. But we really have to want it. How do we compare with Thomas and Peter now?

### **SUNDAY 31<sup>ST</sup> AUGUST**

#### **Christian Solidarity Worldwide (CSW)**

The preacher at the United Parish Communion at 10.00 am in St Peter's will be Baroness Cox, the President of Christian Solidarity Worldwide. CSW is a human rights charity working on behalf of those persecuted for their Christian beliefs. This involves their workers, Baroness Cox included, often being involved in dangerous missions as they seek to find out the truth. They are not particularly welcome by some regimes because they expose the abuses being perpetrated.

Baroness Cox is at the sharp end of CSW operations, a courageous woman and a gripping speaker.

This opportunity to hear her speak is a great privilege for us and one we should not miss.

Try to make 10.00 am on Sunday 31<sup>st</sup> August at St Peter's a priority.

#### **CSW Week of Prayer for North Korea June 23<sup>rd</sup>- 29<sup>th</sup>**

CSW called for a week of prayer for the suffering church in North Korea and many people here responded to that call, having seen a video and read literature about what is happening to Christians in that country. A letter was signed by several people and sent to the recently set up North Korean Consulate in London expressing grave concern. CSW believes that the suffering of Christians in that closed and dark country is the worst in the world.

Please continue to lift up our brothers and sisters there in prayer.

#### **SHAKESPEARE in UKRAINE**

Having spent a week last December in The First City Gymnasium in Cherkassy (probably the most prestigious and academic school there) I knew my way round, but I wasn't absolutely clear what I was to do this time. The school's Director had said that they would like me to "do some Shakespeare" so I arrived with twenty copies of *The Merchant of Venice* in my case, thinking we would read ... discuss ... possibly even stage a scene or two. On arrival, I was confronted by forty 16 year olds wanting to perform the whole play!

Without a doubt it was one of the biggest challenges I have ever faced. However, exactly three weeks after that first meeting we staged the first of our two performances, and a local TV crew were there to record it. It is not for me to say that it was an excellent production but I have to admit that, as scene followed scene, I really was thrilled: I felt like a gardener who plants twenty Tulip bulbs and then is rewarded with not just twenty beautiful Tulips but also a host of Daffodils, Peonies, Lilies. That is a tribute to the WONDERFUL VITALITY of the students, their enthusiastic commitment and their creativity. And when it was all over they were asking when we could do another!

Nothing overtly "Christian" about this project. However, there developed that wonderful camaraderie that often comes when a group of people work extremely hard together to achieve a

worthwhile but challenging goal, and I shall always treasure the card that the students gave me at the end. Also, there was food for thought: for example, Shylock says of Antonio, the merchant of Venice, "I hate him for he is a Christian." What is a Christian? Was Antonio clearly a Christian? Are there, should there be, clear signs which distinguish a Christian from someone who is not a Christian? A good spring-board for discussion!

As always when I go to Ukraine under the auspices of *Hope Now* I was tremendously aware of the power of prayer. The prayer-support of those at home is truly invaluable; it's like the cushion of air beneath a hovercraft which enables it to move over water, beaches, fields, roads. (Can a hovercraft move without that cushion of air?) So many little God incidences too; I think it was William Temple who said that we can't actually prove that all those amazing little moments of help, uplift, inspiration are God's hand at work but the less we pray the less of them there seem to be! I returned exhilarated, exhausted (to be quite frank, drained!), and determined to give more time to prayer.

Thank you to all who helped to raise a magnificent total for Christian Aid in the Milnthorpe and Ackenthwaite areas during Christian Aid Week 11<sup>th</sup> – 17<sup>th</sup> May.
