My Dear Friends,

Do we mean what we pray? We look at the Church in these islands and we have emotions swinging from the depressing to the exhilarating. We all know that what we need is God's renewing power. We pray for it earnestly because in our clear-thinking moments we know that any progress is beyond us. But as we pray for God's revitalising power we may be uttering under our breath 'but not here'. The church prays for God to do a 'new thing' in his church - but elsewhere! God's renewal is resisted and those whom God is using are accused of seeking division. If it is God's church then the division is caused by those resisting God. The majority, if you look at the Bible, is invariably wrong!

I believe that God is moving powerfully among his people today and none of us should surely want to miss out on what God is wanting to give us by just trying to preserve things as they are. The manna the Israelites ate in the desert was a gift from God for that day and there was a fresh supply for each day. This says something about God wanting us to have his fresh gifts (our daily 'bread') not yesterday's gone stale. It is worthwhile reflecting on the 'diet' we are choosing.

Sometime ago I heard of a church in the north of England which was in trouble - the building was declared unsafe and could not be used. Various historical groups said it must be repaired though they were unwilling to help. There was a danger that the parish would be divided up among its neighbouring parishes. The building took matters into its own hands - it fell down! The people worshipped in the local school but then it was burnt down causing them to move into a hut. On top of that the vicar retired and they felt very lonely. The bishop found a man who was willing to come in spite of there being nothing there, but they had to wait ten months while he recovered from a serious operation

They had no building but they remained strong. The new vicar was instituted in the hut. The church continued to grow and they decided to build a new place for worship - it was in the form of a tent to remind them that were a pilgrim people, moving on as God commanded. They grew when they had no fixed abode and they discovered that buildings could be a serious impediment to growth. The 'tent' caused them to focus on people who were, as St. Peter put it, the living stones, with Jesus the cornerstone and God the builder.

We are the people of God here, whether it be St. John's, St. Thomas' or St. Peter's. We are the living stones and we should try to think of our buildings as nothing more than tents. If we do it will help us to discover God's renewing power and the church will be a living community reaching out into our villages.

May we discover the freedom of being living stones and the joy of fresh blessings each day.

### HOLIDAY for ORPHANS in CRIMEA

No wonder Czars and Top Communists liked to go to the south coast of Crimea for holidays: it's very beautiful and, with cliffs, sea and sun, is ideal for a summer break. And that's where Mary and I went with Vic and Sue Jackopson and fifteen others this summer to give a week's holiday to twenty-four boys and girls, aged 10-16, from HOPE NOW foster homes in Ukraine. They loved it: swimming in the sea (really warm), having boat rides (especially on the banana boat!), games (exhausting), craftwork (peaceful), and exploring the hills and cliffs. One morning we left our hotel at 4.30 a.m. and were on the top of a nearby cliff to see the sun rise an hour later. An unforgettable expedition.

Most of the youngsters have suffered grimly terrible starts to their lives. For example, one girl, when only 10, was abandoned by her parents and left to fend for herself; two sisters had been orphaned and were found living in squalid conditions with a grandmother who was an alcoholic and who sent the children out to beg. It was truly wonderful to see how, now that they are part of loving Christian families, they have been able to grow, physically as well as emotionally. Not being spoilt westerners the children didn't complain about the hotel as, I'm afraid, several of us did: built as a Sanatorium by the communists it wouldn't earn even half a star by English standards! But really that didn't matter; being in such a beautiful place and surrounded by children who were so obviously enjoying a great holiday, and benefiting from it, was a delight.

### **A Question:** **What do you know about** **Plumtree Hall ?**

Answer....

*It is that large house in the middle of Heversham, with the attractive gardens.*

*It's a care home, isn't it?*

*Or a nursing home?*

*Anyway, what's the difference, these places are all either run by the council or by commercial companies for profit.*

Would it surprise you to know that Plumtree Housing Association is neither funded by the local authority nor is it a profit-making concern?

The roots of the Association go back to a local benefactress, Lilian Watson, who bequeathed her residence, Plumtree Hall and a cash legacy to a "charitable housing society" That body ultimately became Plumtree Housing Association.

Miss Watson also expressed the wish that preference for residence at Plumtree should be given firstly to persons residing in the "Ecclesiastical Parish of Heversham" and secondly to residents of the "Administrative County of Westmorland". Since 1971, Plumtree Housing Association has been providing accommodation for up to 15 residents in this Grade 2 listed Georgian mansion surrounded by extensive mature gardens. The Association is a non-profit making body and carries out its work without grants or subsidies. We are not a nursing home or care home

The aim of Plumtree is to provide a friendly and safe environment which offers each resident the maximum possible choice, privacy, respect and independence. Residents have their own en-suite apartments which they are encouraged to furnish with their cherished personal possessions; they lead their own lives and come together for the main meals of the day, which are prepared by the resident housekeeper and staff.

As a Retirement Home, Plumtree Hall is unable to provide personal, medical or nursing care, but encourages residents to arrange such services from external sources if required.

Plumtree also offers respite accommodation, for example, to enable relatives to enjoy a holiday break, knowing that their elders are in a safe and friendly environment for a temporary period. Given the charitable aims of the Association, the cost of accommodation at Plumtree is kept to a minimum and is a fraction of the cost of similar commercial organisations.

### **Plumtree Management Committee and Visitors**

At the heart of the work of the Association is the Management Committee and the resident Visitors, all volunteers. These dedicated men and women give freely of their time to ensure, not only that the Hall is maintained in the style envisaged by the late Lilian Watson, but also that the needs and welfare of our elderly residents receive all of the attention they deserve.

The Committee and Visitors represent a cross-section of the local community, containing both active and retired professional people, members of the caring professions and ordinary folk. The one common thread is that these are all people who wish to serve their community in their own way.
