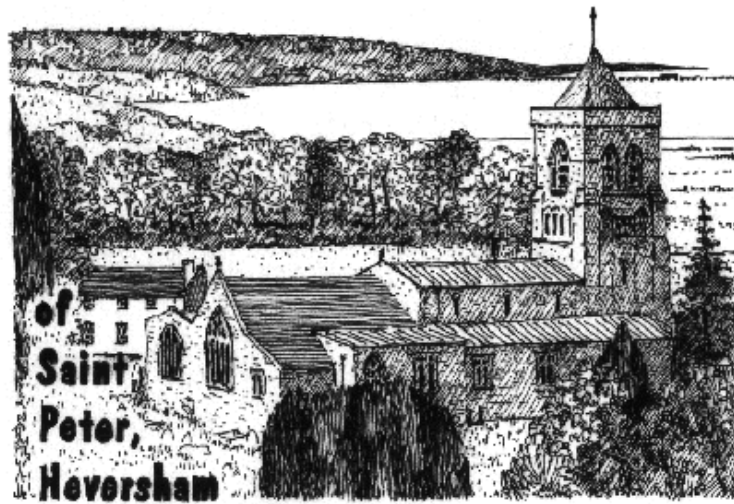

My Dear Friends,

How often we hear people say "I can pray to God anywhere". Now I would not disagree with this but, let us be honest, it is so often offered as an excuse for not identifying with the Body of Christ, the local congregation of believers. While I can agree with the phrase there are still some conditions that must apply.

Prayer is not a casual chat with God when the mood takes us. Time must be given to talking with God. So we start with silence, especially inner silence, and pause in that silence. We don't rush in! Our physical posture is and is not important. It is important that we are at ease because we cannot leave our bodies behind, but the actual posture, providing that we are at ease, does not matter. We can pray sitting, lying down, kneeling or standing as long as the physical does not intrude.

In prayer we turn to God for his own sake. God is Person not just a means to an end. How would we like it if our friends just regarded us as useful? We acknowledge what sort of Person God is - all-perfect, all-glorious, all-good, all-living and all-holy. This assures that our response is thanks and praise which are the starters for any prayer.

We must also share things with God - everything, not just our troubles and grumbles, but also our joys.

In prayer we are focussed on God so we do not go looking for 'beautiful feelings'. Prayer is our unworthy offering to God, not a means of self-satisfaction. No matter how uplifting prayer is we are still 'unprofitable servants' as a prayer puts it. The essential elements in prayer are simplicity, obedience and the spirit of trust, because in prayer we are out to find God rather than lose ourselves. We praise God rather than bewail our unworthiness because His greatness is more important than our littleness.

Prayer is not an intellectual exercise - it is rather communication. It is a response in love to the Love of God so prayer does not stop. We may have to go and get on with everyday life and work but that is not a reason to stop sharing and communicating with God. Let Him into every part of our lives 'until (as another prayer puts it) work itself becomes worship and our every thought be to His praise'.

We are a Team !

About a year ago the Deanery produced a plan for reorganisation to take into account the reduction in the number of Stipendiary clergy available. Part of this plan was the creation of the Kent Estuary Team, which would consist of the seven parishes around the estuary – St John, Levens; St Peter, Heversham; St Thomas Milnthorpe; St Michael and All Angels, Beetham; St James, Arnside; St James, Burton and Holy Trinity, Holme. These parishes would share 3.33 stipendiary clergy, plus the NSMs, retired clergy and readers who are already in the parishes.

Since the beginning of this year there have been a number of meetings of lay representatives from each parish to explore ways in which we can join together and grow – each of the constituent parishes has ideas and initiatives to share so that we can build a strong team, which will be able to go forward in confidence to meet the challenges which will face us in the coming years.

The Bishop of Carlisle has asked John Hancock to begin to build the team and at the meeting of the lay representatives on 15th September he outlined his vision for the team.

The cooperation has already started based on the Diocesan ‘Survival to Revival’ plan where we have shared our individual parish aims. There were strands running through the aims of each parish which will unite us and draw us together. We intend to go together in a coach to the service in the Cathedral on 13th November to present these aims.

This is an exciting opportunity for us to come together with our fellow Christians in the area to present a good picture to the outside world and benefit from all the different skills and experience within our seven parishes. Let us go forward enthusiastically on this next step of our journey.

Milnthorpe church clock has stopped ...

... at 12.00, so for the last few weeks in Milnthorpe it has been permanently midday or midnight. The problem is that the clock and chiming mechanism is now nearly 60 years old, and it is literally suffering from loose teeth. Just three years ago the complicated system of wires and hammers that controls the chiming and the striking was overhauled and a night silencing mechanism was added. But the clock mechanism itself is now showing its age. The whole mechanism (the clock, the chimes and the hourly striking) is driven by weights, with a large pendulum controlling the movement of the clock. It does this by allowing the escapement wheel to move one 'tick' with every swing of the pendulum. It is this escapement wheel which is causing the problem. It is a bronze wheel about 15 cm across with an array of teeth sticking out at right angles, and it is these teeth that cause the 'ticks'. Unfortunately after nearly 60 years of ticking some of the teeth are coming loose, and if the clock is started, after only a few minutes it stops. The looseness in the teeth amounts to only a few thousandths of an inch, but that is enough to stop the clock.

So the escapement wheel has had to be removed (this alone was quite a complicated manoeuvre), and taken to the workshops of the Cumbria Clock Company near Penrith, where it will be re-drilled and fitted with a new set of teeth. We hope it will not be too long before the clock will be going again.

By the way, when the clock is going again it needs to be wound up twice a week. And this is not quite the same as winding up the grandfather clock in your hallway. The weights for the clock itself and for the hourly striking are not too bad, but the weight for the chimes, which go every quarter of an hour, is a monstrous thing weighing around 4 cwt (about 200 kg), and every three or four days it has to be wound up around 12 metres – which is 60 turns of the large handle.

This really is 'pumping iron'.

CARLISLE DIOCESAN PLAN

During the last few months all parishes in the Carlisle diocese have been studying a series of six leaflets about various aspects of church life.

Under the title '**from Survival to Revival**' groups have been thinking about Worship, Discipleship, Young People, Giving, Mission and Ministry, and for each subject two aims have been set for each congregation. Finally, PCCs have met to decide on which 2 of these 12 aims will be concentrated on during the coming year.

St. Peter's Heversham have chosen firstly to establish more of their successful home groups, and secondly they will be reviewing and renewing worship.

St. Thomas' Milnthorpe have prioritised Youth Work and will be working with other groups who plan to establish a youth club in the village. Their second aim is to develop the lay ministry to help with tasks that do not necessarily need to be undertaken by ordained priests.
