This month's letter has been written by the Revd Canon John Hancock, 'caretaker priest' of Levens, one time vicar of Heversham and Milnthorpe.

My Dear Friends,

Isn't prejudice a marvellous thing! It enables us to reach conclusions, make decisions, hold opinions and have attitudes with great conviction and all that without us having to spend time and effort finding out the facts. What a wonderful time-saver it is!

Prejudice is, of course, connected very closely with insecurity as well as with pride. The facts, were we to ascertain them, could be unsettling - they might involve change in all sorts of areas of life. The simplest course is to stick to our prejudices.

But that is not the way of the Christian Faith. We are told not to 'judge anything before the time' which is precisely what prejudice is - prejudging people, events and situations without any evidence. The way of our Faith is Jesus. That is what he said he is, so let us take him as our model and see where he leads us.

One way in which he shows us is in the time he spent in the desert preparing for his ministry. (We remember this time particularly in the season of Lent which starts this year on 1st March). Jesus did not rush into his ministry - he waited for God's timing, sought God's way and God's wisdom - and when God said 'start' he started, and he continued in God's way. There was no human prejudging, unlike the way many responded to him. 'Can anything good come out of Nazareth' was one comment made about Jesus, completely ignoring the facts. 'Come and see' was the immediate and appropriate response.

Perhaps this Lent it may be a good idea to pray asking Jesus to help us to sort out our lives, to see what is based on fact or prejudice and to enable us to have the courage to see, face and accept the facts.

It is good to know that there is a cure for prejudice - 'Come and see'.

Ruth is at present Assistant Curate in the Cartmel Peninsular Team Ministry (CPTM) and also Windermere Deanery Training Advisor. The exact date of her moving from Cartmel and starting her ministry here in Levens is not yet decided but it will be as early in 2006 as is possible.

LENT PROJECT 2006
St. Peter's Heversham
and St. Thomas' Milnthorpe

The Lent Project chosen after prayerful consideration is to be in support of **Hope Now**, an organisation working in **Ukraine** and **South Africa** in hospitals, orphanages, prisons and education. We have had a long association with Hope Now, mostly through Robin and Mary Orr, and have been privileged to have Vic Jackopson, its founder and president, come to speak to us on several occasions, often accompanied by various Ukrainians, about the work of the mission organisation.

Hope Now's work in Ukraine has been very blessed, and the work being done in God's name and will has flourished and expanded.

The **Lent Project for 2006** is to raise funds for **Kompass Park (Compass Park)** in **Khreshchatik, Ukraine**. It is a former school building in grounds near a river, leased by Hope Now and owned by Ukrainian Christians which is to be turned initially into a Summer Activity Centre to hold the usual summer programmes for young people – camps, canoeing and much more! It has the name **Kompass Park "because we want it to be used to show children and young people the way to Life with a capital L"**. It may be used outside summer months as a Language School, giving young people the opportunity to learn foreign language skills and therefore find employment.

We hope to invite Jon Budgell, the man in charge of the Hope Now office to come to speak to us during Lent about Hope Now and the project. A main need is the provision of 2 industrial ovens for the kitchen – these will cost £620 each. It would be wonderful to raise enough to purchase one or both of these!!

Please look out for **information** – and the usual **envelopes** to put money in during Lent! - when the Project is launched on **Sunday 26th February**. As usual, the last date for returning envelopes will be **Easter Sunday, 16th April**.

Women's World Day of Prayer is a world wide movement of Christian women of many traditions who come together to observe a common day of prayer held on the first Friday in March each year. The Day of Prayer begins on the International Dateline as dawn breaks over the islands of Tonga in the Pacific and continues across each continent until the last Services of this special day are held back in the Pacific on the islands of Samoa, circling the world in prayer. This year the theme of the Service is 'Signs of the Times' and has been prepared by the Christian women of South Africa.

The Service is Interdenominational and in Milnthorpe the Church of England, the Methodists and the Roman Catholics join together to produce the Service each year. In the Anglican Church both Heversham and Milnthorpe are involved. Although this Service is not part of the Mothers' Union, it is Milnthorpe-with-Heversham Mothers' Union who organises it.

Did you know ?

Easter Sunday is the first Sunday after the Paschal Full Moon. In the early Church the date depended on who made the observation and what calendar they used. Some agreement was made in 325 and all went well until the 1580s when the Western Church changed calendars and the Orthodox didn't. In the West, Easter Sunday can be any time between 22nd March and 25th April.

Carnival and Mardi Gras

Originated as a preparation for Lent. Meat, eggs and dairy products had no place in the house for Lent. The feasting to finish the meat was called 'carnival' from the Latin for 'leaving the meat behind'. The eggs, butter and milk were eaten up on the day before Ash Wednesday. The French call it Mardi Gras or Fat Tuesday.

Pancake Day

– Tuesday 28th February this year.
The pale English version of Mardi Gras is also known as Shrove Tuesday. Shrove comes from the Old English "shrive", meaning to confess sins, to receive penance and absolution. Hence, people used to go to church on the day before Ash Wednesday to be "shriven".

Levens Women's Institute

Members of the British Legion and other visitors swelled this November Open Meeting to about sixty for the very interesting slide talk by Mr Andrew Lowe on Churches in the National Park.

In chronological order, he showed churches both inside and out, ranging from the Norman church at Isel of A.D. 1130 with its thick walls, narrow windows and rounded arches, to the late Victorian churches at Field Broughton, 1894, and Ambleside Methodist, 1898. Particularly notable were Gosforth with its tenth century cross; St Bega's by Bassenthwaite Lake with a Victorian exterior but features a thousand years old inside; Lowther with its Norse hogback tombs, medieval columns and round arches; Caldbeck and Cartmel Fell, built like a barn and reflecting the prosperity of the wool trade; St Martin's, Bowness, with its marvellous stained glass; Crosthwaite of 1200 which was originally Keswick's main church; Staveley tower of 1388 and Crook tower of 1620; Matterdale with its steep roof which was once thatched; Troutbeck 1562; Ings and Brathay Hall both showing Italian influence and Georgian features, the former with its marble floor of 1726; Bassenthwaite with its spire in the French style, and finally St Mary's, Ambleside, with Victorian exterior but a feast of stained glass inside.

At the A.G.M. in October, Liz Smith stepped down from the Presidency and the Committee and was thanked for all her hard work. The rest of the committee were re-elected with the addition of Shirley Smith, and Krysia Brodie continues as Secretary with Sheila Watson as Treasurer.

Explanation from a letter from Milnthorpe Primary School Headteacher Andy Blackman about the CHILDREN'S CENTRE DEVELOPMENT.

After many months of negotiations I can now let you know that plans have been finalised for developing a Children's Centre on the school site. Funding is now available to re-model parts of school to accommodate Children's Centre Services.

What is a Children's Centre?

- They are means of joining up health, education, social care, childcare, family support services for young children and their families to make it easier for them to get to and use these services.

What do Children's Centres provide?

- Childcare linked to early education for children 0-5 years of age.
- Health services and family support services for the children and their families.
- Links to Jobcentre Plus
- Links to educational and training opportunities for adults.
- A base for childminders.

Where will Children's Centres be?

- Milnthorpe Children's Centre will be one of 16 Children's Centres being developed in Cumbria. The next nearest Children's centre is based in Ambleside.

Who is involved in developing the Children's Centre?

- Milnthorpe Children's Centre is being developed through a partnership between the school, our Community Development Centre, Joeys, the Out of School Club, volunteer parents, health workers, Job Centre Plus representatives and representatives from voluntary organisations.

How will the Children's Centre be funded?

- We have secured £250,000 to develop the Children's Centre premises on our site along with additional revenue funding to support the provision of a range of support services for children and their families.
- In addition we have attracted further funding to provide improved Library facilities in our school which will be undertaken within the same building project.

Where will Milnthorpe Children's Centre be sited?

- The current Foundation Stage Unit will undergo extensive re-modeling to accommodate all the requirements of the Children's Centre. At the conclusion of the building programme we will have a completely re-furbished building customised to the needs of early education and childcare.

What facilities will be available in the Children's Centre?

- Alongside a Foundation Stage Unit, which will accommodate 52 part time Nursery places + 16 Reception children, the Centre will have a 26 place Children's room plus a Baby Room for 6 children. There will also be a Shower room, laundry room, offices and kitchen.

Who will use the Children's Centre?

- The development of the Children's Centre will bring together under one roof, the work of the Foundation Stage Unit and Joeys. Early education and Child Care will exist side by side for the benefit of families throughout the local area.
- Joeys will be able to extend the services they offer to include Child Care for under 2s.

When will it happen?

- The building programme will begin following the Half term break in February and it is planned to be completed in August.

Copies of plans for the building programme will be displayed in the school Foyer, the Foundation Stage Unit, the Community Development Centre and Joeys as soon as we have sufficient copies. There is no doubt that this is an exciting development for the school. We look forward to the completion of the project and the enhancement it will bring to serving the needs of families and children in our community and the improvements it brings to the totality of the school environment.
