This month's letter has been written by The Reverend Ron Rutter.

Dear Friends,

As I write these notes the early March snows are receding and the prospect of Easter seems a long way away. However as we all know, in a matter of a few weeks we will be entering another Holy Week and with it the opportunity for each one of us to take stock of our lives, consider what the passion of Jesus Christ means to us individually and to reflect on those incredible events 2000 years ago.

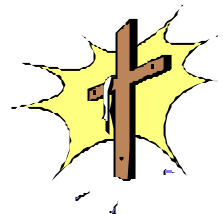
Whatever we may hear there are several simple facts regarding Jesus which we ignore at our peril. He did live, he did perform incredible acts, he was called the Messiah and he was crucified – the historian Josephus refers to 'Jesus called the Christ' being crucified. Perhaps this is the root cause of our problems – if the gospel accounts are true then they tell of such an amazing love that we frankly can't understand it. All too often we try to resolve issues with force – despite the evidence that it has rarely worked.

Just consider for a few moments what Easter really means – that the creator of our universe considers each one of us so special that he was prepared to send his son to live and die to show that there was nothing he was not prepared to do to demonstrate his love. Reading the gospel accounts confirms that Jesus did not have an easy life – conceived out of wedlock, born in a town far from home, spent some time as a refugee in Egyptand ultimately was crucified for crimes he had not committed only to rise again on the first Easter Sunday.

Perhaps the key question is 'dare we accept this story as being true?' because if we do accept it then surely we must respond, we must seek to learn more about him and we must want to show our gratitude by being more like him.

May the joy of this Easter time be special to you.

Growing Well was funded in 2003 with the aim of providing people recovering from mental health problems opportunities to develop their confidence and skills in the workplace.

We achieve this by offering volunteering opportunities throughout the running of our Soil Association certified social enterprise based at Low Sizergh Farm. We grow and sell organic produce, provide accredited training in horticulture and run an educational programme aimed at increasing the connections between local school children and their food.

We offer all kinds of opportunities for people recovering from mental health problems to participate in Growing Well. Volunteers undertake activities throughout the organisation, from seed-sowing to financial management, tractor driving to web-design.

As we move into a frosty March here at Growing Well we have been busy ploughing the fields. We've finally got the hang of our new yellow tractor and we'll be ready to start direct sowing seed in a fortnight. Our hardy volunteers have been braving snow and ice to come in and carry on the good work – some days it's been too frozen to dig!

In the propagation tunnel we have thousands of plants beginning to grow; kohlrabi, lettuce, tomatoes and broccoli to name a few! And through all this we've still been harvesting our winter salad crops which are available in the shop at Low Sizergh Barn most weekends.

April brings Easter Day and our glorious Eastertide Services, as we sing “Jesus Christ is risen today”... “Alleluia” following the sadness of Good Friday. April also “brings the primrose sweet, scatters daisies at our feet”, Kathleen Partridge writes – “to climb a bank, and see the primroses I love so well – here’s fragrance for the weary heart, by God himself designed – because I gather peace with each primrose that I find.”

Children and all of us look forward to the chocolate Easter eggs, but some of us still colour and boil, hens’ eggs, carrying on the ancient custom of pace (Pasch) egg rolling- do you take part? It is lovely for children to remember. Have you ever wondered why the date of Easter Sunday varies from year to year? It can be on any Sunday between March 22nd and April 25th, because it is fixed by the phase of the moon. Easter is always on the first Sunday after the full moon, following the vernal equinox, which takes place on March 21/22. All other dates in the Church’s calendar are reckoned from Easter day. **HAPPY EASTER TO ALL!!**

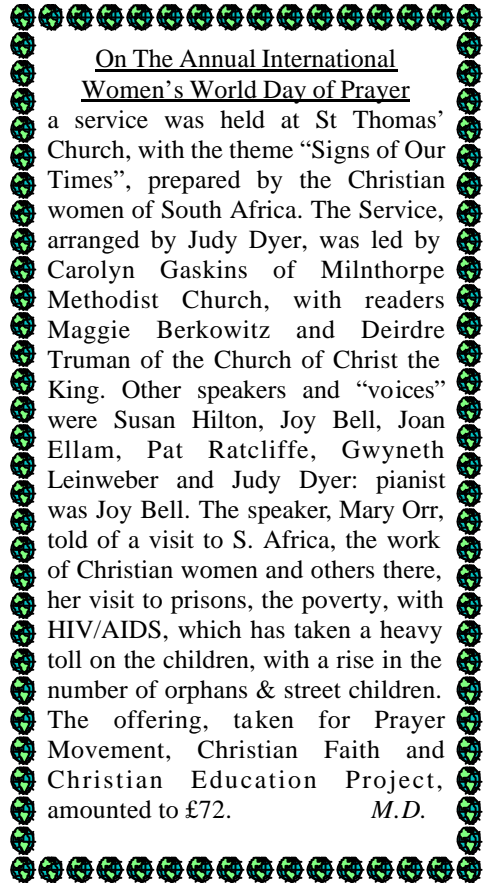
Branch leader Joan Ellam welcomed guest speaker, Robin Orr of Levens, to the March meeting of Milnthorpe-with-Heversham Mothers Union, and said that he had chosen the opening hymn, also the reading, given by Judy Dyer to coincide with his illustrated talk, "CALLED TO UKRAINE". Mr Orr spoke of his many visits to the Ukraine, following his call by God for Christianity in that region; and work of the HOPE NOW Project there, which embraces help, and work with health, hospitals, prisons, prayers, a choir and education. Thousands of people have been baptised since this began – including many in prisons. Slides depicted the delight of children on receiving the shoe gift boxes which Mr Orr had conveyed from Cumbria. He was sincerely thanked by Pat Radcliffe, and a collection was taken for HOPE NOW.

Mrs Ellam said that the women's world Day of Prayer was successful, in spite of a heavy "blizzard" of snow, at the time; as was the M.U. Wave of Prayer meeting held at Linda Cooper's home. On Lady Day March 25th a M.U. Faith lunch was held at St Georges' Church, Kendal. An outing to visit Benridding West Yorkshire M.U. branch was arranged for May 24th. A get well card was signed by all members for Marjorie Mashiter.

During the Carlisle Diocese Mothers Unions Wave of Prayer week, March 1-5 eight members of Milnthorpe-with-Heversham Mothers Union, held a wave of prayer meeting at the home of M.U. member Linda Cooper. Leaders were Joan Ellam and Judy Dyer, with a Bible reading by Joan Atkinson. A talk by Mrs Cooper described the work of our link branches in Nigeria, Kenya, Zululand, Swaziland, and Northern Argentina – while also remembering the

Diocese of Carlisle, and the furtherance of the M.U. gowns of love, *Away From It All*, The 1 – 5 Parenting Projects, as well as local work at Haverigg Prison, Kendal Child Centre and outreach work of the new Diocesan Choir.

St John's, Levens, **Annual Parochial Church Meeting** **8th March 2006**

This, held in the Institute on a rather cold evening, was quite well attended. It started, as usual, with the Vestry Meeting for the election of churchwardens for which there were two nominations – Robin Orr to serve a second year and Barrie King willing, and now able again, to return to the office he held for several years until about two years ago. Without other opposition these two were elected and I was thanked for my service now ending. We then heard and accepted where necessary in the usual pattern of these meetings, the minutes of the one last year, the annual parish report, electoral roll report, the annual accounts, and reports from the churchwardens, the deanery synod, the Kent Estuary Team Shadow council and progress on our Survival to Revival activities. Three people were elected/re-elected to join the other six elected members of the Parochial Church Council. All these reports were satisfactory though there was some discussion on points of interest or even, perhaps, difference! But, whatever these may have been, we all agreed that we are looking forward to the arrival of the Revd Ruth Crossley as Priest-in-Charge here – licensing Friday 19th May, 7.30 p.m., in church – and are very grateful to John Hancock and Margaret for being willing to start their “retirement” by taking care of us for as long as it took.

Children's Society (St John's, Levens)

On the first Sunday of Lent the Revd Tim Harford came to speak to us about the work of the Children's Society. He told us of the four categories of children and young people with whom they work: refugees and asylum speakers, those with disabilities, those awaiting trials or sentencing and those who run away from home – the latter numbering a staggering 100,000 a year. Several of the congregation already use collecting boxes for the Society and another seven people took them at the end of the service. Our Lent Project is to provide funds to support 1) the Society's work for one runaway child and 2) for two sessions for groups in schools; these help the youngsters to understand clearly the implications of running away and give them ways of sorting out their problems and obtaining the right help. Those of us who heard Tim speak were thankful for the Church's involvement in such vital work and realised how much it needs our support. Envelopes for the Lent Project can be found, clearly labelled, at the back of the church and should be returned on Easter Sunday or put in the locked wall box by the door.

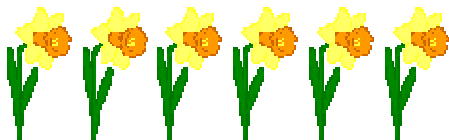

The Chrismon Tree

This is the tree which was decorated at Christmas wholly with Christian symbols - white for purity, gold for majesty and tiny white lights to remind us that Jesus is the 'Light of the World'.

After Christmas the tree was stripped of its branches and made into a crude cross which has been standing in church during Lent.

There was a good attendance for the February meeting, where Mr Brian Adams gave a slide talk on the National Garden Scheme. He started with a brief history of the scheme which dated back to 1926, when the Queen's Nursing Council were short of funds and a Council member, Elsie Wagge, persuaded people to open their gardens charging a shilling admission. Sixty people agreed and by the 1930s a thousand gardens were open. In 1980 it became a charity in its own right, with the late Queen Mother its patron, now

succeeded by Prince Charles. Twenty million pounds have been raised for charities, especially the Marie Curie and Macmillan nurses. The gardens are open from March to September and there are 61 in Cumbria. Mr Adams' enthusiasm shone through as he showed his beautiful slides. These included Yewbarrow House, Grange, with its breathtaking views over the estuary, Holehird with daffodils, monkey puzzle trees, winter heathers and wonderful magnolias; Holker with its rhododendrons and unusual sundial; Askham Hall and the five small gardens of Leece Village. We were also transported to Northumberland, to Wallington, an idea for a future trip, and even to the West country: Porlocks Weir and Barrington Court in Somerset, and Glendurgan in Cornwall with its unusual maze of laurel, pagoda tree and pocket handkerchief tree. Mr Adams had several amusing stories to tell and gave members a chance to air their knowledge of plant names in this wonderful feast of colour.

Levens Over 60's Club

Mr Brennan presided and 21 members braved the bitterly cold wind and were rewarded by an excellent slide-talk by Canon and Mrs Ellis of Allithwaite on the River Danube. The river rises in the Black Forest and flows through Germany, Austria, Slovakia, Hungary, Serbia, Romania and Bulgaria to reach the Black Sea. Canon and Mrs Ellis boarded a cruise ship in Vienna and sailed to the Black Sea and back, disembarking for coach trips to cities and villages *en route*. In Slovakia they saw ruins from the recent conflict, but Bratislava is now restored. As it flows through the Hungarian plain the river is 2 km. wide. The architecture in Budapest is outstanding and much rebuilding has taken place since the communist era. There are displays of Magyar riding skills and wonderful village crafts, brightly coloured embroidery, etc. In Romania the Danube flows through a narrow gorge with locks, where the former communist rulers built a huge hydroelectric scheme. The area has a strong Roman heritage: a language akin to Latin and a road and bridge built by Trajan. Gypsies originated here. A revival of Christianity followed the demise of communism, and traditional costumes feature a lot. Serbia showed signs of austerity. Many conflicts between Islamic Turks and Christians took place: Belgrade has been flattened 40 times. Bulgaria had to fight fiercely for independence.

Returning to Vienna, a tour of the city was a fitting climax, where the architecture was richest under the Hapsburg rulers. They visited the palace and the library and the wonderful St Stephen's Cathedral with its spire higher than Salisbury's and where much great music, including Mozart's Requiem, was first performed.
