

We have recently welcomed two new Priests-in-Charge - the Reverend Susan Wilson to the Benefice of St Peter's Church Heversham and St Thomas' Church, Milnthorpe and the Reverend Ruth Crossley to St John's Church Levens. For a change for this summer issue, instead of the Pastoral Letter, they both kindly agreed to share a chat about their recent arrivals here - please see overleaf.



“Thank you for joining us Susan and hope that you have received a really warm welcome in Milnthorpe and Heversham since you have arrived – and how are you settling in?” Very well. I’m glad you said ‘settling’ rather than ‘settled’ as it is going to take some time to really get to know the area and the people in it. However, I have really enjoyed the first couple weeks. People have been really friendly and welcoming, extremely open and I have thoroughly enjoyed every moment of my new life.

And have you had plenty of chance to talk to people in the villages, at church, at coffee ?

Yes! I’ve had a chance to talk to so many people, which is hugely different from my previous life, but is one of the most enjoyable parts of what I now do. I have spoken to so many people about so many things from very practical to very deep, which has been great...I do hope it continues.

If people would like to talk to you and haven’t had the chance to yet personally, can they call in at the Vicarage, or is it best to phone ahead to be sure that you are there? It would be better to ring, because a lot of my time is spent out and about, meeting and visiting people and I’m not in at set times. Please do phone and leave a message if I’m not in...I’d love to hear from you...

And have you decided that you will take a day off within the week ? Well, I keep being told very firmly by other clergy that I should, but up to now it hasn’t happened...but I’m sure it will. I love walking and when I’m out it not only gives me a chance to recharge my batteries, but also helps me experience the awe and wonder of God as I see him in the wonderfully dramatic scenery which surrounds us here. It’s super to be high up on the fells and hear and feel the silence: to have time to stop and absorb it. If I am to do this job as well as I can, then having some time to be refreshed will be important - after all, if Jesus needed to get away at times, I definitely will!!

And would you say that, in terms of your life, that things have changed – where you were living and the work you were doing ? They have! It’s a major change. As you know I have been involved in education for many years, and for the last 15 months, I’ve been driving about 600 miles a week on very busy roads and motorways whilst looking after about 22 schools. I don’t miss driving one bit and it’s great to have time to spend listening and talking with people. Life is just as hectic, it’s as busy and I’m working as many hours as I did before but it is much more enjoyable - rather than always being in a rush. I can now spend quality time with people and be involved in a wide range of activities - church and community. I don’t regret in the slightest not having to write endless reports in triplicate - writing a sermon is much more enjoyable! I have had the odd pang of homesickness for the West Country especially when I look at the weather forecast, but with modern technology – email, texts and phone calls, the lines of communication are still open. So yes, it has been a tremendous change, but one I don’t regret.

It’s the people that make the area, not just the view, isn’t it !

Yes, the people are the reason I am here. To share the good news of the gospel we need to be with people ...I did wonder whether coming from the south and being a woman would be a problem...but people have been really gracious and my worries seem to have been unfounded.

You spoke in your Pastoral Letter in the last issue of the Parish News of a Christian journey, so do you feel that you are on the next step...?

Journeys are sometimes strange things aren’t they, we might have a plan of where we want to go, but God’s plan for our life journey is often so much better than the one we’d thought of!- if we’ll let him lead us. Coming here has been a major journey physically, but having taken the step of faith to come here, God has done all I could have expected and more to make me feel I’m on the right path. Perhaps it’s just as well we don’t know all that is to happen ahead of time...but experience tells me that if we do step out in faith, and follow God’s prompts and directions, He will always honour it. We may not be able to see every step of where we are going very clearly, but looking back, we can see where God has been leading us just as clearly as if we were looking at a well lit runway...so all I can do, is see where I’ve come from and trust God for what will happen in the future - both for me and for all of you.”

Susan chatted with Ed Team member Jane Cushnie

“Welcome Ruth, with your combined responsibilities as Priest-in-Charge and Bishop’s Advisor on Continuing Ministerial Education, an obvious question is: You must be very disciplined to fulfil this dual role?”



Yes, there has to be discipline - to cover the things that have to be done: the things that I feel called to do and want to achieve, to meet the everyday demands and to keep some balance for personal well-being to enable me to accomplish all this effectively. The dual role does offer much, though: the possibility of practising the priestly and pastoral functions and the opportunity to use my experience as a trainer to help others.

What was your experience in training? With Barclay’s Bank: immediately before my own study for ordination, in training managers and their support staff to develop a new way of working, to work from home, to make full use of new technology and to be more reliant on their own, without always having the back-up of an office around them. This work took me all round Britain. I was also involved in coaching people to discover their own personal training and development needs as well as running training courses for staff: in that way it links very closely to that half of my present job.

And the other half of the job? Have you always been aware of a vocation to ministry?

Worship has always been special to me, from childhood. An early role model was a nun who worked in pastoral care in the parish, and early on in my teenage life I did think I might be a nun. I have always been fully involved in church life, in things like teaching Sunday school, running youth groups helping with Baptism preparation etc. When I went into the bank it was with a feeling that this was not yet the work that I really wanted to be doing. I trained as a children’s nurse, but when I came back to Allithwaite to look after my family there was no opportunity to continue nursing so I returned to the bank. Survival from a serious road accident reinforced my feeling that I was intended to do other work, and my sense of vocation grew, much later after a move to Penrith with my husband, the time to follow God’s call came and I began to train for the ministry.

In your first service in Levens you preached on prayer. Do you feel that this should perhaps be given more importance than it sometimes is in modern life?

Prayer is fundamental. I practise it in church and at home. One of the things about Celtic Christianity is that in a most practical way there is a prayer for everything, for every activity. The other day in school the children and I practised St Patrick’s Breastplate: “.. Christ before me.. Christ behind me ...” They were able to perform the actions, making their prayer a living activity.

Is there anything particular you enjoy, like gardening or music, when you are trying to recharge and balance your lifestyle? My husband is the gardener! I enjoy walking, cooking and entertaining, and seeing the family. When we are on holiday I enjoy reading, non-fiction rather than fiction, I play the piano a little and we listen to a wide range of music.

Is there any anything special which you have set out to accomplish, in coming to Levens?

It is far too soon to ask or answer that. Except to say two things we are ALL involved in God’s mission to the world, if there is anything to be done, WE will plan and do it TOGETHER. Ideas for change and growth have to come from the church and the community. Above all now, I want to listen, and listen, and listen. Of course, I can only listen if people talk to me! I do want everyone to talk to me, to talk, as I am moving round the village, to come to the vicarage and talk, to phone me up! It is not possible to divide the week into pastoral days and training job days, Fridays may be to some degree a recreational day when we may go and see our family, but answer phones are useful at times when I am not instantly available.

You have been very kind in answering questions. Is there anything particular which you would like to say to us? To say again that I do want to listen; and that development and growth in faith has to start with the individual, after all the meaning of disciple is learner. We all have to recognise that, in all things, we have to start with ourselves, gain in confidence then in word and deed show God’s love to those who want to experience it or who would listen, and then we can watch what God will do”.

Ten members of Milnthorpe-with-Heversham Mothers Union travelled to Ben Rhydding West Yorkshire, by kind invitation of the M.U. branch there (of which our Branch Leader Joan Ellam had previously been the leader).
