



# This month's Pastoral Letter has been written by The Reverend Ruth Crossley

Dear Friends,

*'Remember remember the 5<sup>th</sup> of November...'* November is a month for remembering, but memories are funny things. People tell me that as one grows older one forgets what happened yesterday but can recall clearly events from the distant past. Some talk about remembering the 'good old days', but clearly they weren't always that good. When we moved back to live in this area many memories were triggered for me, memories of people, of places, of happy times and sad. These memories, people, places and events have helped shape, (for better or worse), the person I now am. Through the things that happen to us we are challenged and changed, and we grow.

The 1<sup>st</sup> of November is All Saint's Day when we remember the lives of those who have lived close to God, some even dying for their faith. We remember lives lived as shining examples of Christian faith and the foundation of our faith.

2<sup>nd</sup> November is All Soul's Day; the day when we commemorate all those we have known and loved but see no longer. As Christians we believe we continue to be *'bound together in a communion of prayer'*.

Remember, remember the 5th of November gunpowder treason and plot, we know no reason why gunpowder treason, should ever be forgot. Well I am not too sure about that one but, if memories can teach us anything then with this we remember an assassination plot that did not come off and the killing of the plotters. We remember all that have been victims of political assassinations and all who live today in fear of the assassin's weapon. We give thanks for our democratic society.

On Remembrance Day, 11th November, we remember those who have lived and died for the service of others and also those who have died for their country in war. With our memories we pray for the peace and welfare of all nations. Babette Duetsch wrote, *Old women sit, stiffly, mosaics of pain...their memories: a heap of rumbling stones once built stronger than a city wall.* These are memories, which are strong and therefore make it difficult to forgive and forget. This sort of memory hardens hearts and means peace in places like Ireland and Palestine is still not achieved.

As the month of November comes to an end, we begin to remember the Incarnation, God coming in love to be as one with us and we also look forward to the day when God's Kingdom will come on earth. *Maranatha - come Lord Jesus.* 

Throughout the year each time we meet together as Church round the table, we do so to remember. As we make this remembrance week by week, we do so in the hope we *may have life and have it in all its fullness*. The bread of God is broken to be the food of life. The bread and the wine are symbols of Christ's self-giving love. It is this love that we need to reflect in our lives.

Whatever your memories this month, I hope and pray that you can remember with love, with forgiveness and with faith,



An extract from the local press of April 1832 which describes neighbourliness in action has been forwarded to the Parish News:

#### <u>'BOON PLOUGH'</u> <u>– "And every one helped his</u> <u>neighbour."</u>

This scriptural quotation was never more forcibly exemplified than on the farm at Nether Levens, on Tuesday last. In the rural districts, in this part of the country, when a tenant enters upon a new farm, he invites his neighbours and friends to lend him a helping hand. Mr James Halhead has entered upon the farm of Nether Levens this spring, and Tuesday was his Boon day; it may be inferred that his friends, neighbours, and acquaintances are not few, when we state that there were at one time in motion, 119 draughts, ploughs, and harrows, so that the ground turned up, and the seed covered in, was not inconsiderable in quantity. After the fatigues of the day the men and horses were regaked – the men on roast beef and strong ale, who forgot their toils amidst enjoyment; they drank "Speed the Plough," and sang "Com riggs are bonny o," "Amang the riggs of barley o," &c. &c.
