## Walk Cumbria cause and effect?

Over the last year many people in the churches in Cumbria have been praying and preparing for Walk Cumbria. If you are a regular reader of this magazine then for the last few months you cannot have avoided Walk Cumbria and all the planning for events in this area, and now it is over..... or is it?

Many in our society today think that God is dead, religion is a cause of global conflict and the church is inflexible, illiberal and irrelevant why then would anyone in their right mind embrace the Christian faith? These issues and others came up in the door-to-door interviews during Walk Cumbria. BUT people do embrace the Christian faith, somewhere upwards of 15,000 a year, at a rough estimate.

Some research has been done and this came up with three common features about how people come to faith. First, the importance of **people**. It is people who bring others to Christ, but not special or particular people (not only Walk Cumbria associates or walkers). The research showed that neither did you have to be a minister, or a theology graduate to play this role. Everyone – ‘our son ... my sister ... my gran ... my ex-girlfriend ... this family I teach ... my wife’s colleague...my neighbour’ – did their part.

The second was the importance of God. This aspect is hard to quantify, nonetheless the God phenomenon makes the whole of each person’s story somehow greater than the sum of its parts.

Third, the importance of the Church, time and again, people surprised themselves. They knew all about what was wrong with churches, yet they still spoke glowingly about the impact the Church (meaning the body of Christians) had had on them. This is evident at special times in people’s lives when they come for marriage, baptism and funerals; here the church has a positive influence. ‘They were ... the church family in the proper sense,’ one young man said, and although people don’t attend frequently, they saw the value of church in their community.

Everyone knows how bad churches can be –perhaps the reality is different. Perhaps, for all their faults, churches can be places of love, healing and reconciliation, people+people and people+God .

Remember....when Walk Cumbria fades into a distant memory, we are here, Christians in the communities where we live; enthusiastic, encouraging and loving those around us perhaps a sign that the Kingdom of God is here!

## **Christians Together in Levens**

Our main activity over the last few weeks was preparation and sharing in the visit of the WALK CUMBRIA team to Levens. Six team members stayed in Levens for 4 days before travelling on to Walney Island.

The quiz in the Institute attracted 30 people and the Knipe Family gained the prize, which in good Christian fashion was then shared out to all there. It was good to come together for the joint service on Sunday where Phil (a team member) spoke about the story of Abraham and Isaac and our relationship with God. The team walked round the village inviting people to think about faith and the results of the survey they carried out should be included as a separate sheet in the next Levens edition of the Parish News.

The "BIG" event of the weekend was the Kent Estuary Walk and despite heavy showers early in the afternoon on the day of the walk, the sun made a belated appearance and the Hog Roast on Levens Playing Field attracted a crowd of almost 300 people. Thanks to all those who worked so hard to stage this event and make it the resounding success we had hoped and prayed for. Also many thanks to all who supported and attended this outreach event and contributed £550 towards the substantial costs involved. The total cost of the day was £1000 and the balance is being covered

by grants from C.T.I.L. as well as St. John's PCC and Levens Methodist Church.

The Team's visit proved to be very fruitful and we continue to pray for those who visited us and for those who responded to the Mission. Our thanks are also due to those who provided accommodation in their homes for team members to sleep and/or be fed and to the Trustees of Levens Methodist Church for allowing four team members to sleep in the Church building and opening the premises for use as a daytime base for all the team.

The Seeds have been sown - the Harvest is up to Levens.

1. Walk Cumbria member Donna, from Cambridge told us how the original "Walk of 1000 men" was started by Daniel Cozens (still present leader) – through Faith Mission, with the logo "how beautiful are the feet of those that bring good news", taking the news of Jesus to the outside world, meanwhile staying at homes through the generosity of others.

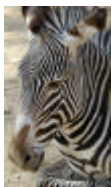

## **St John's PCC meeting 2nd May**

The first meeting of the new PCC year started with a celebration of Holy Communion. It then appointed the PCC officers – secretary Liz Addison; treasurer Chris Band; KE Group representative Doreen Hughes Gain. Among the letters reported was one from the Playing Fields committee about the Family Fun Day planned for 7<sup>th</sup> July. We noted the level of response to the offer of inscriptions on the new memorial stone for cremated remains. (There is still time to respond to this if you wish.) Plans for Walk Cumbria were discussed, as were various matters of church maintenance. And we spent some time considering the provision – or not – of a data visual projector in church. The screen for this could be fixed on the wall above the pulpit and used for various display purposes during service – words of hymns, points illustrating sermons, visual aids, and so on. This is still under consideration. What are your opinions?

## **Lent Groups in Levens**

Although Lent is far behind us now the discussions we had have led to some possible ongoing activities.

The topic of slavery was very appropriate for Lent and we were easily able to gather even more information and knowledge due to the high profile the topic was given in

the press and on the television and radio. The Biblical passages could be found to both support and be at odds with slavery. The fact that slavery still exists today and is evident in many countries in the world, including our own; in the sex trade trafficking and in the way certain modern economic conditions create the effect of slavery.

One group created a banner recognising some of the issues involved in slavery, the other groups thought about a response that involved us recognising different cultures poverty at home and abroad. The outcome was to discover if there was some way we could make a connection with a parish on the African continent and a parish in our own diocese which had a different situation to our own. As the diocese of Zululand is a link diocese with Carlisle diocese we are exploring the possibility of find a link there, and in our own diocese considering a link with a parish in a town. These links would be for prayer and sharing information about each other therefore broadening our horizons.

Levens Over 60s' Club The April meeting took the form of a slide-talk by Mr Robin Orr entitled: 'A holiday in Russia', but as he said, 'holiday' was perhaps as misnomer, as he must have worked very hard to get so many beautiful slides of St Petersburg, Moscow, and the country in between. St Petersburg was a planned city with a grid system like Canberra. Its founder, Peter the Great, was well travelled and brought in craftsmen from all over the world to create beautifully adorned and colourful cathedrals, palaces and war memorials. Abundant use of waterways was reminiscent of Venice. Catherine the Great two generations later carried on the work both outside and indoors, where there were beautifully crafted items of furniture, gilded or often of solid gold.

Moscow by contrast was an old settlement which had grown up gradually, now densely populated and richly decorated, inhabited by wealthy citizens since the fall of communism, in contrast to the poor dwellings in the countryside around. The Kremlin and St Basil's in Red Square were very ornate and colourful, but there were also rather grey looking apartment blocks where the majority of citizens lived. As a background to this colourful show, Mr Orr played some very appropriate music by Rachmaninov featuring a Russian male voice choir.

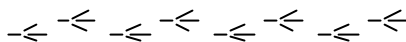

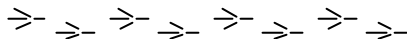
