Dear Friends,

Many of you, who have children or grandchildren, will be familiar with the fact that sometimes, from young voices, come the most challenging and searching questions. One child recently asked, 'What language does God speak?'

It seems that children are not the only ones preoccupied with the question of God's language. This year sees the 400th anniversary of the publication of the King James translation of the Bible, otherwise known as the Authorised version.

It has been praised as one of the literary works, alongside the complete works of Shakespeare and the Oxford English Dictionary, that has helped shape the English language and culture. Many well known turns of phrase still in use today, such as, 'the apple of his eye,' go the second mile,' a thorn in the flesh,' and 'by the skin of his teeth,' to name but a few, come from the King James Bible. As someone recently said, the words of the King James Bible have become 'all things to all men'.

For many, it is held as the only truly valid edition of the Bible and over the years has been debated and argued over by its critics and defenders. The arguments swing between the beauties of its language for some, against its antiquity for others.

At one time, the King James translation was read in every church at every service, so it isn't surprising that its language passed from the pulpit to the street. It came out of church and embedded itself in the everyday culture.

Many in this country, around the world, and in our own churches, will mark this 400th anniversary with special services and events.

'What language does God speak?' Maybe the opening of John's Gospel gives us a good answer, for it suggests that if God has a language, it is that of love, a love that became real in Jesus, 'the word' who ' became flesh and dwelt among us.'

Are we joining the debate for or against the King James version? In the end, the translation that matters most, is that of our lives.

MONEY WELL SPENT

In 2008 whilst we were at Kisiizi Hospital in Uganda we were asked by St Peter's missionary committee (otherwise known as 'Window on the World) if there was a project at the hospital which would benefit from the Lent offering. At the same time we had heard of a gifted primary school boy who wanted to go to secondary school but whose father could not afford the fees, because he was studying for the Anglican ministry and had no income.

We suggested that supporting Nicholas would be a good use for the offering.

The offering came to £1106.47 which was sent to the hospital in April 2008. The fees are about £125 per term, so the offering was enough for about 3 years. His progress has been regularly reported on a notice board in the church.

The school year is from February to November. In his first year Nicholas came 5th out of a year group of 192 in a good school. He came to see us and promised to try harder the next year. His class position has been similar in subsequent years.

He hopes to become a doctor and work at Kisiizi hospital; with these results it seems he will be able to fulfill this ambition.

We are very pleased to have been the intermediaries in helping Nicholas, and are grateful to St Peter's for the opportunity to help Nicholas. It has also been a great encouragement to his parents in their calling to the ministry.
