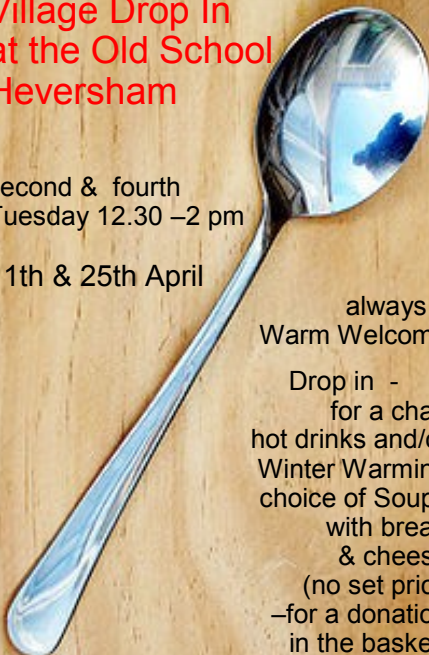

I ordered a watch online with personalised engraving for my partner's upcoming 40th birthday. The company has since gone out of business. I keep phoning and emailing them but can't get through to anyone. I can't afford to buy another gift until I get my money back. Please can you help?

If the company has gone into administration, it may still be able to fulfil outstanding orders, but if it is already in liquidation, you'll need to try to get your money back. If you're unsure about what state the company is in, the Citizens Advice website has information on how to find out.

Is there a shop or office you can visit, to get an update on your order, or request a refund? If that isn't possible, the next steps depend on whether it's a limited company (it will have ltd or plc after its title) or if it's a sole trader (someone who runs their own business) or partnership.

If it's a limited company, you'll need to get details of the administrator or receiver - the person dealing with settling the trader's debts. The names of those administrators will usually be on the website of the company that's gone bust. You should register your claim as a creditor on the GOV.UK website. Fill out the form with details of what you're owed and send it to the administrator.

Unfortunately, there's only a small chance you'll receive any money back because you'll be last in a long list of creditors who need to be paid.

If you paid by debit or credit card, you could also try getting your money back with a Section 75 claim or a chargeback claim to your card provider or bank. Full details about both these types of claims can be found on the Citizens Advice website.

If the seller was a sole trader or partnership and not a limited company, pursuing a Section 75 or chargeback claim is your best option.

Every case is different when traders go under, but you can call the Citizens Advice consumer helpline to find out exactly what your rights are:

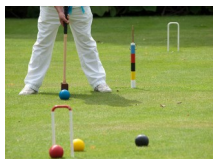

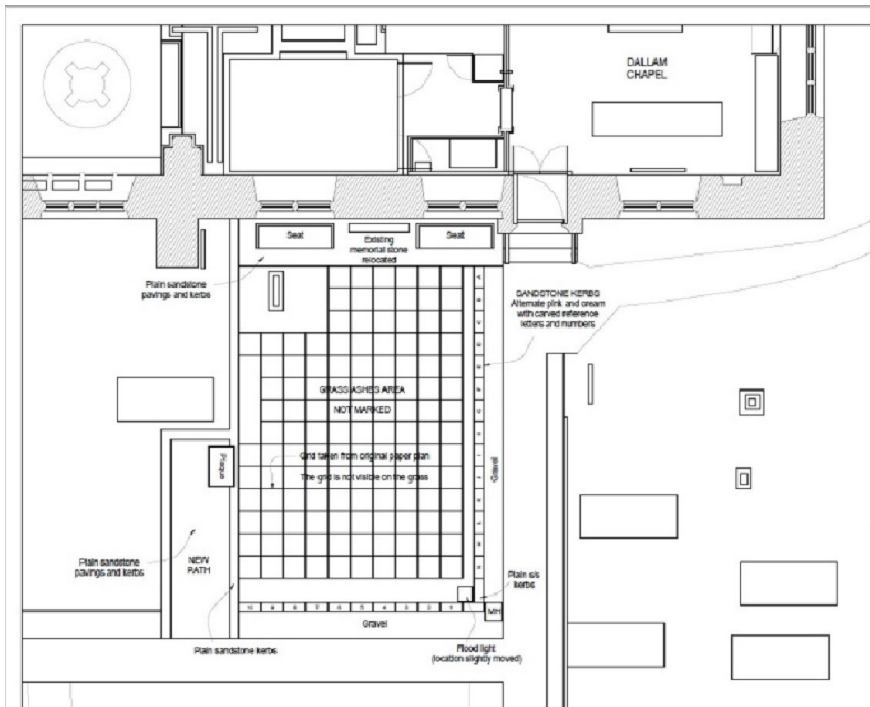

Ashes Area at St Peter's Church Heversham



I am pleased that so many readers found the item about the improvement to the ashes area in the churchyard at St Peter's interesting. I am pleased to report that we have made good progress in raising the necessary funds. Thank you to everybody who has made a donation so far, it has made a real difference. The cost of the work is £18,000. If you would like to contribute, please pass your donations to a church member who will ensure that it reaches the treasurer, a churchwarden or the vicar.

The Cross Shaft at Heversham

One of St Peter's special treasures is the shaft of the Anglian cross. **It connects us back to life and worship here 1200 years ago.**

It is a very significant relic – but it sits out of sight when the door is open and exposed to the weather when it is not.

It is also in the way of the alterations planned for the entrance area.

With the full support and encouragement of the Diocesan Advisory Committee (DAC), the PCC plans to relocate it and to display it with the respect that is due to it.

Our plan is to place it on a purpose designed plinth under the tower, with an associated display that contextualises it and explains its significance.

To do this, we will relocate the pews and remove the wooden staging to reveal the original stone flags underneath. We will also move the 15th century chest, to sit against the west wall. Bespoke lighting will be installed to illuminate the cross shaft and chest.

There will be room for chairs to be used for the very occasional service which requires the additional space.

We are going to explore alternative locations within St Peter's for the pews that will be moved. The DAC approval for the scheme expressly requires us not to dispose of any of them, whilst we experiment with various options during a twelve-month period.

This exciting development is actually the first step in realising our plan for the improvement of the entrance area and toilets. Although we will try to secure additional grants, it can be funded from the money we already have for the overall project.

What is the Mother's Union?

A 4 million strong organisation in nearly 90 countries with a vision of a world where everyone prospers. It's focus is to support "mothering" in all it's forms. It is a Union because it represents people (men & women) who are united in advocating and supporting families and those whose lives have met with adversity.

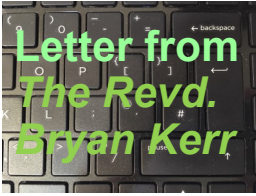

Dear Friends,

Easter is more than chocolate; Easter is more than eggs. The Christian faith rests on that central claim that Jesus rose from his grave. Often people love to celebrate his birth at Christmas. Important as that is, the main focus of the New

Testament is on the final few days of Jesus' life – and beyond.

Is it reasonable to believe such an unusual and impossible thing as the resurrection of Christ? "I don't believe it" was a sentiment found from the earliest days of Christian history, first on the lips of the disciples themselves. Thomas has become known as 'Doubting Thomas', yet he was convinced he has seen Jesus alive; doubting Thomas ended up as believing Thomas. James was the half-brother of Jesus. He and the rest of the family had been convinced Jesus had gone mad when he began preaching, yet he ended up as a foremost figure in the early Church. He is also recorded as someone who encountered Jesus risen from the dead. Paul was the fiercest persecutor the church faced in those early years, yet his life was totally changed – he travelled across the Roman world to tell people he had met Jesus after his death. What provoked such a radical turnaround in their lives and thinking? Sceptics and opponents who became convinced a man had stepped out of his grave.

These dramatic reversals are not confined to the pages of the Bible and long ago. Charles Colson, imprisoned for his role in the Watergate scandal, found himself acknowledging this central truth of the Christian faith: "I know that Jesus' resurrection is a fact, and Watergate proved it to me. How? Because the twelve disciples testified that they had seen Jesus raised from the dead, then proclaimed it for forty years, never once denying it. Every one was beaten, tortured, stoned and imprisoned. They would not have endured that if it weren't true. But Watergate embroiled twelve of the most powerful men in the world, and they couldn't keep up a lie for three weeks! You're telling me that the twelve disciples could keep up a lie for forty years? Absolutely impossible."

Lee Strobel was a journalist with the Chicago Tribune. An atheist, Strobel vowed to use his investigative skills as a reporter to disprove his wife's newfound Christian faith. Instead, his research convinced him that Jesus is the Son of God. He published his findings in a book 'The Case for Christ'. He wrote, "I think fundamentally, the question of whether or not Christianity makes sense - whether it withstands scrutiny, whether the evidence supports it or hurts it - always comes down to the Resurrection."

CS Lewis, the author of *The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe*, described himself as a 'most reluctant convert'. He too became convinced that Christ had risen from the dead, and that was the turning point of his life: "The New Testament writers speak as if Christ's achievement in rising from the dead was the first event of its kind in the whole history of the universe. He is the 'first fruits,' the pioneer of life," He has forced open a door that has been locked since the death of the first man. He has met, fought, and beaten the King of Death. Everything is different because He has done so."

May you know God's blessing at Easter, and ponder afresh the meaning of the season.
