



The patio has containers growing herbs, available for anyone to use.


There is a fern and hosta garden in the shaded garden, a rock spiral for children to play.

Dear Friends,

"Many forms of Government have been tried, and will be tried in his world of sin and woe. No one pretends that democracy is perfect or all-wise. Indeed, it has been said that democracy is the worst form of

Government except for all those other forms that have been tried from time to time . . ." This famous definition of democracy comes from a speech by Winston Churchill in the House of Commons on 11th November 1947.

As this magazine reaches you, the General Election will almost be upon us. You will not hear me making the case for one particular party or candidate; that would not be an appropriate use of a pulpit, or a page in Parish News.

It is worth taking a step back to consider why we vote and what the role of government is. Churchill's definition of democracy above acknowledges we live in a world of sin and woe. Democracy ensures that one group of sinful people do not get unlimited power for an unlimited period of time; they get replaced with another group of sinful people! Democracy is our best political response to the universality of human sinfulness. It allows for the smooth and peaceful transition of power from one government to the next. We do not have a civil war in order to change leaders; nor do we execute, exile or imprison anyone occupying the office of Leader of the Opposition. This lies at the heart of stable and civil government. When we look at the Bible, we find guiding principles on what God expects from all governments and political systems. Firstly, there is the need for justice, for example: the honesty and integrity of rulers (Proverbs 29 verse 4), a fair distribution of wealth and resources, especially to the poor and disadvantaged (Amos chapter 5) and the just punishment for the wrongdoer (Romans chapter 13).

Secondly, we are encouraged to pray for our political leaders, that they will create a society that provides the opportunity for people to 'lead peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness.' (1 Timothy 2.1-2).

In practice this should encourage us to look deeper and wider, beyond the soundbites, to ask questions that the politicians and the media might not be answering: what is good for all the needs of the whole nation? That prayerful consideration can inform us as we cast our vote. Thirdly we are to submit to rulers (Romans 13, 1 Peter 2) if we are to have the blessing of stable society. Whoever we have voted for, once the election is over and the results declared, the Christian is to submit to the government that God has appointed and we have elected. Commitment to good government means accepting the results and moving from the divisive nature of electioneering to the unifying mode of seeking the common good, under the leadership of whomever God has appointed over us.

But there are two other elections that we might also give attention to.

There is the idea that God votes for us; he has chosen a people for himself. In Christ he has committed himself to us and for us: 'If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all—how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things?' (Romans 8 verses 31-32)

There is also the ongoing need to decide about the Lord Jesus, to put our faith in him for the forgiveness of our sins and the promise of eternal life. Will we vote for him as our rescuer and ruler? No-one needs to wait for an election day to be called. Any day, even today, is a good day to choose Jesus.

- 6. No exhibits may be removed from the Show before 3.30pm. The Association takes no responsibility for the loss of, or damage to exhibits.
- 7. Prize money will be paid by the Hon. Treasurer's desk from 2.30 pm onwards and must be claimed on the form provided by the Secretary at the Show.

- 13a. Definition of a bowl: A vessel for displaying cut flowers in water or for growing bulbous plants and having a mouth width measurement at least equal but usually greater than its height. In floral arrangement classes bowls with one or more than one handle are acceptable.
- 14. All judging will be in accordance with affiliated Societies' rules.
- 15. The Association will not be responsible for any loss or damage sustained by exhibitors during the Show, but all usual precautions will be taken.
- 16. No exhibitor may enter more than 2 exhibits in any one class.

### Top Vase Rules 2024

### Notes for Exhibitors and Judges

The Top Tray Class is for a display of three types of vegetables from the following list of eight. The quantity of each vegetable required for the display is given in brackets: CARROTS (3), CAULIFLOWER (2), ONIONS (3), PARSNIPS (3), PEAS (6 PODS), POTATOES (3), RUNNER BEANS (6 PODS), TOMATOES (6).

O Each type of vegetable will be judged out of a total of 20 points. This is split into three sections as follows: seven points for size, shape and colour; seven points for condition; six points for uniformity. The overall mark will therefore be out of a total of sixty.

O All vegetables are to be displayed for effect. The vegetables must be displayed within an area measuring 18" by 24" ( $45 \times 60$ cm.), without bending any part of them. No part of any exhibit may exceed the size of the tray. A tray or board measuring 18" by 24" ( $45 \times 60$ cm.) can be used to display the vegetables, or the area can be simply marked on the staging. Where a tray has a lip or edge, it is the internal measurements that must not exceed 18" by 24" ( $45 \times 60$ cm.). O Flowering stems can be taken from ANY flowering plant. The different kinds of plants need to be taken from different genera. For instance, pinks, carnations and sweet william - which are all dianthus - would not be classed as different kinds.

O A vase by definition, is any vessel that can be used to hold cut flowers and which is taller than it is wide at its widest point.

O The Top Vase class is open for anyone to enter, and judges should use their discretion, bearing in mind that the entries may come from inexperienced exhibitors.

O Judges - note the display has to be viewed all round.

O Any queries that may arise, regarding anything other than the above rules, should be referred to, and decided by, the show officials. Failure to abide by the rules will lead to disqualification.

### Top Tray Rules Competition Rules

The Top Tray Class is for a display of three types of vegetables from the following list of eight. The quantity of each vegetable required for the display is given in brackets: CARROTS (3), CAULIFLOWER (2), ONIONS (3), PARSNIPS (3), PEAS (6 PODS), POTATOES (3), RUNNER BEANS (6 PODS), TOMATOES (6).

O Each type of vegetable will be judged out of a total of 20 points. This is split into three sections as follows: seven points for size, shape and colour; seven points for condition; six points for uniformity. The overall mark will therefore be out of a total of sixty.

O All vegetables are to be displayed for effect. The vegetables must be displayed within an area measuring 18" by 24" ( $45 \times 60$ cm.), without bending any part of them. No part of any exhibit may exceed the size of the tray. A tray or board measuring 18" by 24" ( $45 \times 60$ cm.) can be used to display the vegetables, or the area can be simply marked on the staging. Where a tray has a lip or edge, it is the internal measurements that must not exceed 18" by 24" ( $45 \times 60$ cm.).

O A black cloth is permitted, and the tray may be painted. Parsley is allowed for garnishing, but no other foliage or accessories, such as plates, sand, or rings will be allowed. Onion tops may be tied or whipped using raffia.

O The Winner of the Top Tray Class will receive a £10 garden voucher; the second a £5 garden voucher and third a £3 garden voucher. **Note for Exhibitors and Judges** 

O Carrots and parsnips must have foliage trimmed to 3" (7.5cm.).

O Peas and beans must be displayed with some stalk attached.

O Tomatoes must be displayed with calyces Failure to abide by these rules leads to disqualification.
